- Matt Fleming and Kelly Lockman Secure New Southfield Headquarters for Habitat for Humanity of Oakland County

Early this year, Matt and Kelly were asked to facilitate the purchase of Habitat for Humanity of Oakland County's new Southfield building, including assistance with review of the purchase agreement, title commitment and survey, and drafting and negotiating the closing documents with the title company and seller to consummate the transaction.
